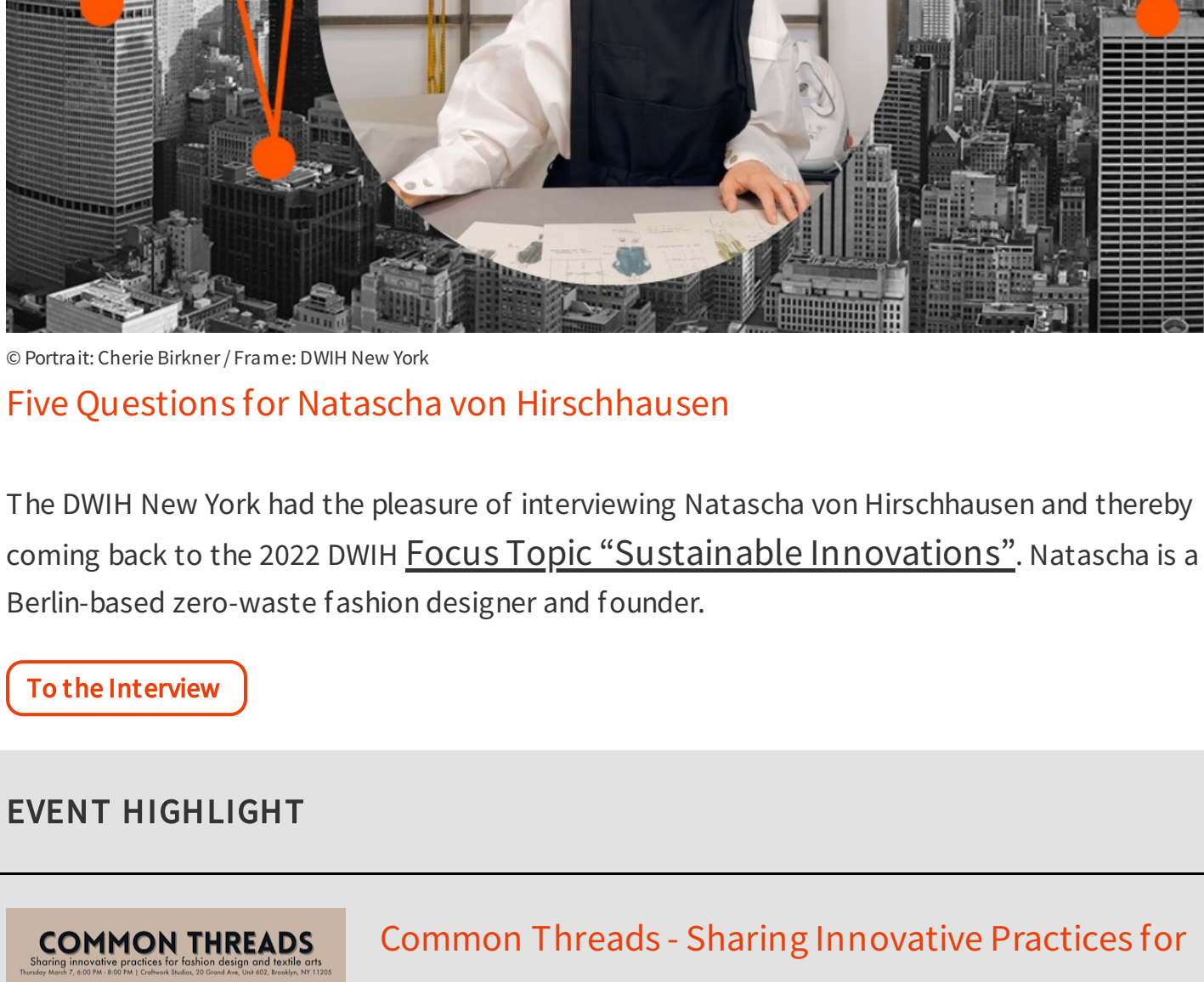
Dear reader,

The €500.000 Einstein Foundation Award for Promoting Quality in Research, unlike most scientific awards, does not honour the most excellent or original research, but rather efforts and ideas aimed at fundamentally enhancing the reliability of research. Together with the BIH QUEST Center for Responsible Research, the Einstein Foundation Berlin welcomes nominations of individual researchers and small teams as well as applications of institutions who have done pioneering work in this domain. 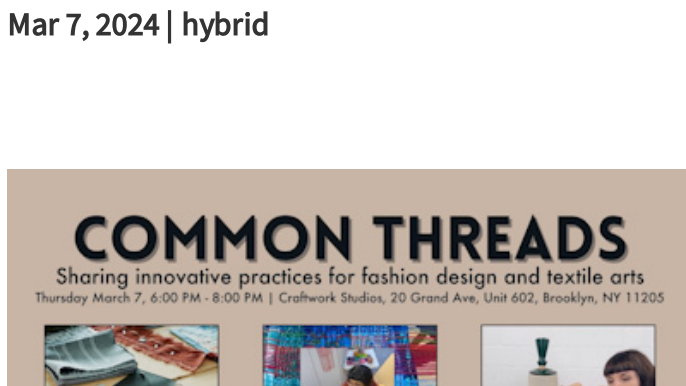
GUILD - Women in Entrepreneurship Program

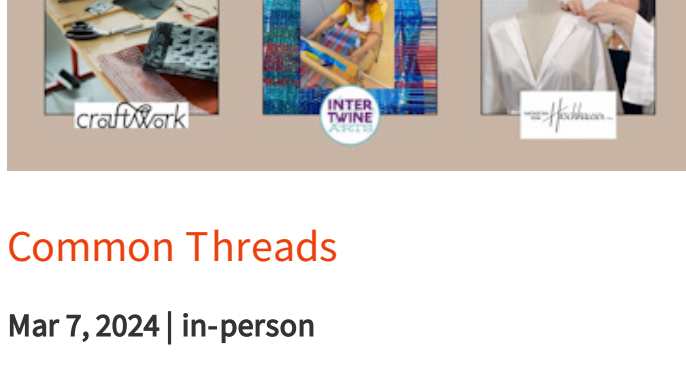

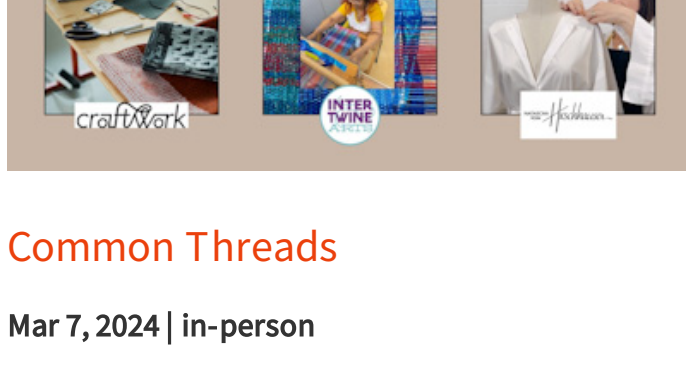

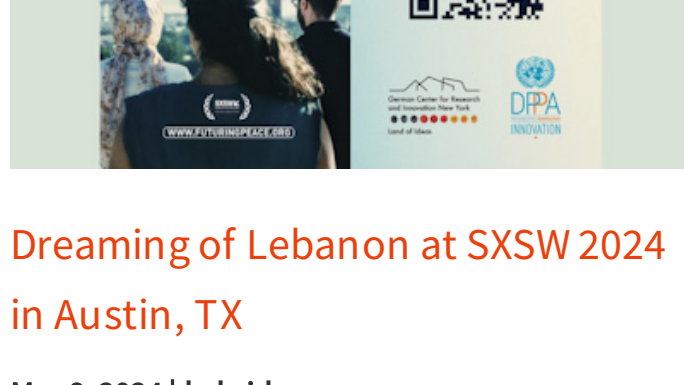

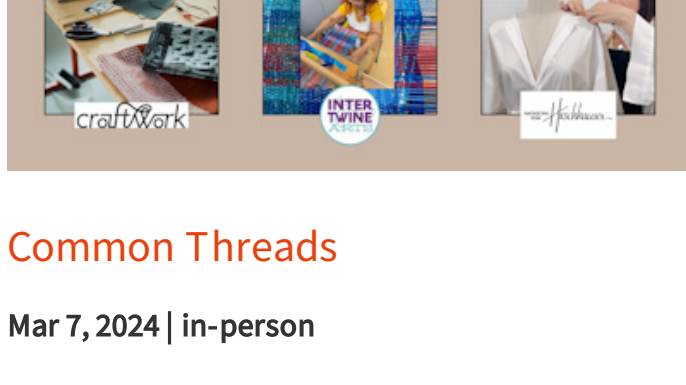

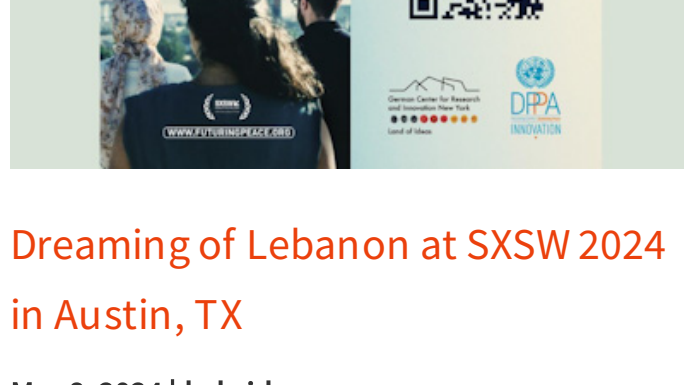

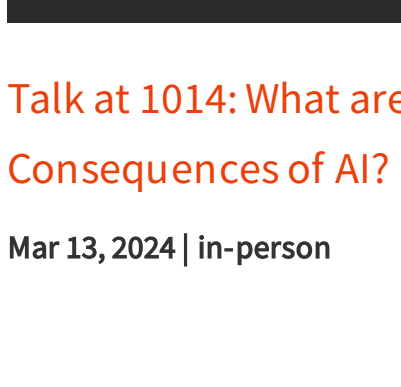

GHI hosts Symposium "Trust in Museums: Potential, Challenges, and Societal Importance"

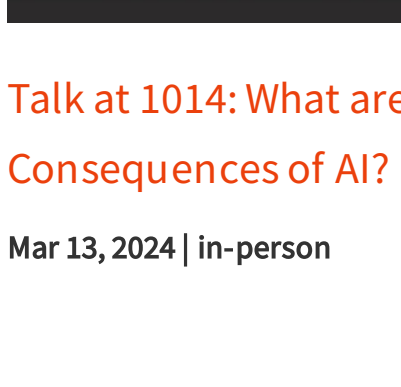

University of Cologne's Climate Research: How Stable Is the Antarctic Ice Sheet?

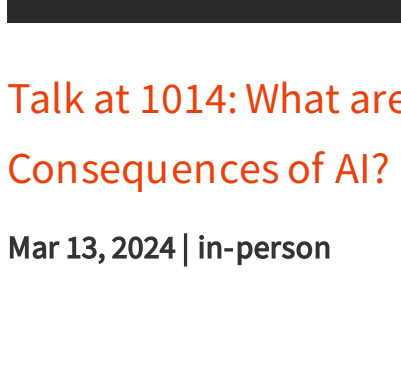
Geologists from the University of Cologne are investigating the influence of past climate and environmental changes on the East Antarctic Ice Sheet in regions that are ice-free today.

Universität Hamburg Applying for Fifth Cluster

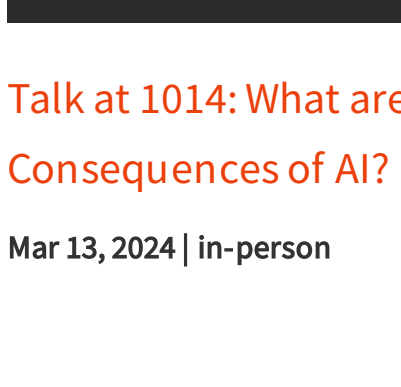

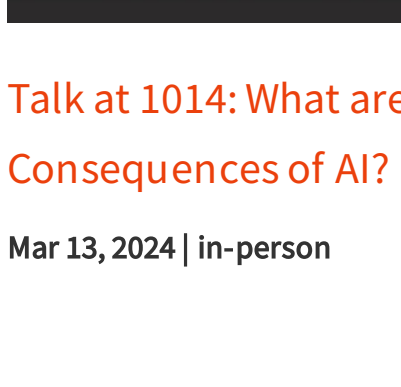
3D-Printed Pneumatic Modules Replace Electric Controls in Soft Robots

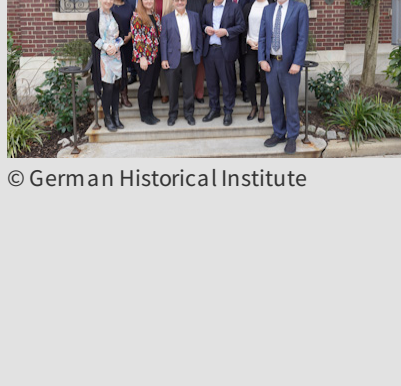
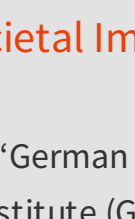
